To whom it may concern

I have the distinct pleasure of working together with Dr. Ehsan Kashfi as a postdoctoral researcher on a broader research project led by myself at the University of Copenhagen. The project *Iran Beyond Iran: Diasporic Politics, Transnational Entanglement and Digital Publics* is funded by a prestigious grant from the Independent Research Fund of Denmark, and I was lucky to attract Dr. Kashfi for one of two postdoctoral positions right after Dr. Kashfi had finished his very interesting and important PhD dissertation in Political Science at the University of Alberta, Canada. Apart from the PhD, Dr. Kashfi had previously obtained an MA in International Relations at Durham University, UK. A PhD project, which Dr. Kashfi should turn into a monograph.

Dr. Kashfi is currently working on crucial, understudied aspects of Iranian diaspora politics. His first subproject dealt with the politics surrounding the Iranian national team's participation in the 2022 FIFA World Cup in Qatar. The second subproject deals with the Azeri-Iranian diaspora's political activities in Canada, raising interesting questions of ethnic and national identity in a transnational setting. The third subproject will deal with Iranian right-wing nationalism in the diaspora in Europe and North America.

In this capacity as my fellow researcher, Dr. Kashfi has consistently demonstrated his excellence in research. He is meticulous, critical in the true sense of the word, and constantly pushing the boundaries for thinking with the tools of political science, sociology and even anthropology in pursuit of a deeper understanding of Iranian history in its broadest sense.
