## Personal Statement with respect to my Post-Doctoral Application

Eventually, I finished my MA with a high score 19.11 out of 20. Since my graduation, I have been working as a lecturer in various well-known universities in my country. I really enjoyed my career in academia and I have dedicated myself to my work working in an academic atmosphere. Moreover, in the pathway of my academic works, I decided to pursue my education in PhD level, and Finally I graduated PhD in Old Iranian Languages and culture at Institute for Humanities and Cultural Studies in Tehran, Iran, once again with attaining the highest grade "A" among other students. During my research in PhD level, I acquired more knowledge of reading and analyzing Avestan language, Eastern Iranian Languages, Khotanese and Soghdian, and Western Iranian Languages, Middle Persian (Pahlavi) and Parthian Languages Lexically and grammatically, and reading and analyzing Sanskrit language as well. my MA degree in Near and Middle Eastern Studies with a Zoroastrian focus was completed at
